



2018 POSTDOCTORAL RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP – TE REO ME NGĀ TIKANGA MĀORI Information and Guidelines for Applicants

Purpose

Ngā Pae o te Māramatanga (NPM) is committed to building Māori research capability and capacity and improving Māori research career pathways, and in particular in te reo me ngā tikanga Māori. A new and further NPM Postdoctoral Research Fellowship (PDRF) has been created that will contribute towards this goal.

The PDRF is a two-year full-time position and will support an outstanding Māori graduate who has recently completed a doctoral degree, and is committed to conducting and supporting research that contributes to NPM's vision of "Māori leading New Zealand into the future" and to our te reo me ngā tikanga Māori research programme.

The proposed postdoctoral research must align to NPM's Te Reo me Ngā Tikanga Māori research programme, which seeks to increase and enhance the revitalisation and normalisation of te reo me ngā tikanga within research settings, communities and society.

The successful NPM PDRF applicant will be based at one of [NPM's partner institutions](#) and be mentored by a NPM researcher(s) from that institution. Additionally, they will be mentored by at least one member of the [NPM Research Leadership Team \(RLT\)](#).

In addition to pursuing an innovative research project, the NPM PDRF will be expected to contribute to, and participate in, the goals and activities of NPM including research and researchers within the te reo me ngā tikanga programme. NPM has a broad range of activities, research teams and networks which will present opportunities for engagement. The nature of this commitment will be negotiated with the successful applicant, in conjunction with the relevant supervisor(s) and NPM RLT members.

Value

- The NPM PDRFs will have a value of up to **\$80,000** salary per annum plus any reasonable salary associated costs (for example, ACC and superannuation). Note, no institutional overheads are granted with NPM PDRFs as per NPM policy.
- The NPM PDRF is eligible to apply for a grant of up to \$10,000 per year for research expenses.

Eligibility

- Application for the NPM Postdoctoral Research Fellowship is open to individuals with a proven track record of academic excellence.
- Applicants should be New Zealand citizens or hold residency in New Zealand at the time of application and be of Māori descent.
- Applicants must hold a Doctor of Philosophy or an equivalent degree. However, applications will be accepted from persons who have submitted their thesis but have not yet received results of their thesis examination. If their PDRF application is successful, the award and commencement of the Fellowship will be conditional on awarding of the degree.
- Applicants would normally have received their doctoral degree in the past 5 years.
- The successful applicants must take up the fellowship by **1 November 2018** but earlier if possible.

Criteria

Assessment of NPM PDRF is made in accordance with these selection criteria:

- (a) Demonstration of academic excellence;
- (b) Innovation and transformation potential of the research project;
- (c) Alignment of PDRF research project to NPM's Te Reo me Ngā Tikanga Māori rangahau programme;
- (d) Feasibility of completing the research project within two years;
- (e) Commitment to engaging with Māori communities in the research design, conduct and outcomes of the research project.
- (f) Understanding of how the PDRF will contribute to the Fellow's professional development.
- (g) Ability to work as part of a team and contribute to, and participate in, the goals and activities of NPM.
- (h) Ability to support and contribute to one or more of the NPM research themes, including being able to work with members of the NPM Research Leadership Team.

Applications: Applications open on 15 June 2018 and **close at 5.00pm on 3 August 2018.**

All applications are to be made via the online application form at <http://www.maramatanga.ac.nz/npm-grants> (application details required for this submission can be found below).

Applicants should allow one month for the application selection process to take place after the advertised closing date.

Selected applicants should expect to participate in an interview and discussion about their application as part of the assessment process. Applicants will be notified of the outcome of their application at the earliest opportunity.
